



About


We are an Episcopal Parish of the Diocese of Tennessee located in Fayetteville, the county seat of Lincoln County, TN. We were founded in the 1880s and have had a continuous presence as either a Mission or Parish ever since.



Location



We are located on Washington Street, just north of the historic town square.

Worship

We hold either the Holy Eucharist, typically Rite II, or Morning Prayer at both 8:00 AM and 10:30 AM every Sunday. Our 8 AM service is spoken word and our 10:30 service includes music.

We recently began holding a midweek Healing Eucharist most Wednesdays of the month at 7 PM. These are preceded by a book study beginning at 5:30 two Wednesdays of the month.

Our 10:30 AM Sunday Morning service and our Wednesday book study and Healing Eucharist are streamed live on our Facebook page, <https://www.facebook.com/smmepiscopal>.

Parish Ministries

Our Episcopal Church Men (ECM) and Episcopal Church Women (ECW) meet regularly. Our ECW meets between our two services on the third Sunday of every month. Additionally, they hold a biweekly lunch and learn on Tuesdays. Our ECM also meets biweekly, alternating Tuesdays with the Ladies Lunch-and-Learn, at 9am for a “coffee, no agenda” fellowship.

Our chapter of Daughters of the King (DOK) is active and are currently holding training sessions for prospective new members.

Community Outreach

We support several local charitable organizations, providing both resources and volunteers. The two most notable are the Hands of Mercy Center (<https://handsofmercycenter.com>) and our local Good Samaritan Association.

We also make our parish hall available to organizations such as Alcoholics Anonymous, the Child Development Center of Lincoln County (<https://cdctn.org/child-development-center-of-lincoln-county>), and our local Humane Society (<https://www.facebook.com/fayettevillelincolncountyanimalshelter/>).

We also participate in community events such as the Host of Christmas Past (<https://www.hostofchristmaspast.com>). For this event we hold “Bundts and Blessings” where we open our sanctuary for tours, allow passers-by to ring our bell, provide a Wayfarers Rest in the parish hall with access to restrooms and our nursery, and hold a bake sale.
